## An Act to Provide Compensation to and to Limit Work Hours of Jail Employees

- 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
  - Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §1511 is enacted to read:

#### 3 §1511. Hours of employees

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4 Beginning January 1, 2024, a jail employee may not work more than 18 hours in a 24-5 hour period except in exceptional circumstances or when the Governor has declared a state 6 of emergency pursuant to Title 37-B, section 742, subsection 1. For the purposes of this section, "exceptional circumstances" means circumstances beyond the control of the sheriff 7 8 or jail administrator that pose a threat to the safekeeping of persons committed or transferred to or detained in the custody of the jail, the safe operation of the jail in 9 10 accordance with this chapter and the standards set pursuant to Title 34-A, chapter 1, subchapter 2 or the safe performance by employees of the jail of their duties. 11

- 12 Sec. 2. Compensation for jail employees. The Treasurer of State shall issue 13 additional compensation of \$2,500 to each employee of a county jail under the Maine 14 Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, chapter 13.
- 15 SUMMARY
  16 This bill prohibits, beginning January 1, 2024, a jail employee from working more than
  17 18 hours in a 24-hour period except in exceptional circumstances or when the Governor
  18 has declared a state of emergency. The bill also directs the Treasurer of State to issue
  19 additional compensation of \$2,500 to every jail employee in the State.

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
