1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3197 is enacted to read:
3	§3197. Data collection and reporting regarding care
4 5	1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
6 7 8 9	A. "Approved care" means care services provided by an essential support worker to older persons, persons with physical or intellectual disabilities and persons with behavioral health challenges that have been authorized for reimbursement or direct payment under the MaineCare program, a federal waiver or another state program.
10 11 12 13 14	B. "Essential support worker" has the same meaning as in section 7401, subsection 3. 2. Data collection required. The department shall establish a process to collect data relevant to the report described in subsection 3 about approved care provided to MaineCare members, persons receiving home or community-based approved care under a federal waiver or persons receiving approved care under another state program.
15 16 17	3. Report required. On a quarterly basis, the department shall publish a report and make that report available to the public. The report must include the following information categorized by county:
18	A. The number of individuals receiving:
19 20	(1) Zero percent of the amount of approved care the individual is approved to receive;
21 22	(2) One percent to 25% of the amount of approved care the individual is approved to receive;
23 24	(3) Twenty-six percent to 50% of the amount of approved care the individual is approved to receive;
25 26	(4) Fifty-one percent to 75% of the amount of approved care the individual is approved to receive;
27 28	(5) Seventy-six percent to 90% of the amount of approved care the individual is approved to receive; and
29 30	(6) Ninety-one percent to 100% of the amount of approved care the individual is approved to receive;
31 32 33	B. The number of beds that are licensed and physically available and have no current staff on hand to attend to a patient who would occupy the bed in residential facilities that provide approved care; and
34 35	C. If there is a waiting list for approved care, the number of individuals on the waiting list.
36 37 38	Sec. 2. First report. The Department of Health and Human Services shall publish the first report required by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 3197 no later than March 1, 2024.

1	SUMMARY
2	This bill requires the Department of Health and Human Services to collect and publish
3	data on a quarterly basis relating to care services provided by an essential support worker
4	that have been authorized for reimbursement or direct payment under the MaineCare
5	program, a federal waiver or another state program.
