
HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H P 799,
L D 1251, "An Act to Clarify Immunity from Liability for Municipalities Engaged in
Recycling Activities"

Amend the amendment in the 2nd instructional paragraph in the last line (page 1, line
18 in amendment) by inserting after the following "activities" the following 'A written
policy adopted under this subsection must be developed by a credentialed industrial
hygienist and must comply with United States Department of Labor, Occupational Safety
and Health Administration requirements As used in this subsection, "credentialed
industrial hygienist" means an industrial hygienist certified by a national association of
industrial hygiene professionals'

Amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or
section number to read consecutively

SUMMARY

This amendment adds a requirement that the written policy establishing reasonable
safety standards for recycling facilities be developed by a credentialed industrial hygienist
and comply with federal law
