1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §683 is enacted to read:
3	§683. Dangerous weapons at voting places
4	1. Prohibition. A person may not carry or discharge a dangerous weapon:
5 6 7	A. While present in a voting place or on public property within 250 feet of a voting place during the time that the polls are open until the completion of election duties at the voting place on election day;
8 9	B. In a location where absentee voting is occurring in the presence of the clerk or on public property within 250 feet of that location; or
10 11	C. In a location where the clerk's office is receiving or emptying absentee ballots via a secured drop box or on public property within 250 feet of that location.
12 13	For purposes of this section, "dangerous weapon" has the same meaning as defined in Title 17-A, section 2, subsection 9.
14	2. Exception. Subsection 1 does not apply to:
15	A. A law enforcement officer in the performance of the officer's official duties; or
16 17	B. A dangerous weapon in a locked motor vehicle that is not removed from the motor vehicle or carried by a person.
18 19	3. Penalty. A person who violates this section commits a civil violation for which a penalty of not more than \$1,000 may be adjudged.
20	SUMMARY
21 22 23	This bill restricts dangerous weapons at voting places. The bill provides an exception for law enforcement officers in the performance of their official duties and for dangerous weapons locked in motor vehicles.
