An Act to Provide Alternative Methods of Payment to Health Care Providers

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- **Sec. 1. 24-A MRSA §2436, sub-§1-A,** as enacted by PL 2005, c. 58, §1, is amended to read:
- 1-A. A claimant, including a health care provider, may submit simultaneously a claim for payment with all carriers potentially liable for payment of the claim whether primary or secondary. Payment or denial of a claim by each carrier must be made within 30 calendar days after the carrier has received all information needed to pay or deny the claim whether or not another carrier with which it is attempting to coordinate has acted on the claim. If a carrier makes payments to a health care provider using an electronic processing method by credit card or debit card, the carrier shall also offer the health care provider another method of payment that does not require the provider to pay any additional fees or incur any costs to accept payment of the claim. Any payment made must be in accordance with rules adopted by the superintendent relative to coordination of benefits.

14 SUMMARY

This bill requires a health insurance carrier to offer a health care provider at least one method of payment for claims that does not require the health care provider to pay any additional fees or incur any costs to accept payment from that carrier.
