1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §1483-B is enacted to read: 3 §1483-B. Local option exemption for volunteer firefighters and emergency medical 4 services persons 5 1. **Definitions.** As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings. 6 7 A. "Emergency medical services person" has the same meaning as in Title 32, section 8 83, subsection 12, except that the person receives no or nominal compensation or reimbursement for actual costs incurred for responding to emergency medical services 9 10 calls or participating in required training and meetings. 11 B. "Volunteer firefighter" means a member of a separately incorporated volunteer fire department or municipal fire department who receives no or nominal compensation or 12 13 reimbursement for actual costs incurred for responding to fire calls or participating in required training and meetings. 14 15 2. Optional exemption. A municipality may by ordinance exempt from the annual excise tax imposed pursuant to section 1482 one vehicle owned or jointly owned by a 16 17 resident who is a volunteer firefighter or a volunteer emergency medical services person. To qualify for the exemption, the resident volunteer firefighter or resident volunteer 18 emergency medical services person annually must present to a designated municipal 19 20 official documentation demonstrating that during the previous 12 months, the resident 21 actively served as a volunteer firefighter or volunteer emergency medical services person 22 and used the vehicle for which the exemption is being requested to respond to fire calls or 23 emergency medical services calls. A municipality may impose additional eligibility 24 criteria, including, but not limited to, duration of service as a volunteer firefighter or emergency medical services person, required response to a minimum number of fire or 25 emergency services calls and training requirements. 26

SUMMARY

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This bill allows a municipality to provide an exemption from annual excise tax for one vehicle owned, separately or jointly, by a resident of that municipality who is a volunteer firefighter or volunteer emergency medical services person, as long as that vehicle is used to perform those volunteer services.
