4 5	1. Income verification requests by state and local housing authorities. Upon request, the department shall coordinate and facilitate timely access for the Maine State
6	Housing Authority or other housing authority under Title 30-A, chapter 201 to income records of a recipient of assistance under this subtitle. Records obtained under this section
8 9 10	may be used only in accordance with federal and state law. Recipients of the records are responsible for the protection and security of personally identifiable information contained in the records.
11 12 13	2. Rules. The department may adopt rules to carry out the purposes of this section. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

This bill directs the Department of Health and Human Services to coordinate and facilitate access to income records of recipients of the department's income supplementation and assistance programs requested by state and local housing authorities. Records may be used only in accordance with federal and state law, and these authorities are responsible for the protection and security of personally identifiable information contained in the records.
