SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 847,
L.D. 1333, "An Act to Protect Children by Modernizing Internet and Digital Media
Filtering Requirements for Education"

Amend the amendment by striking out everything after the substitute title and inserting
the following:

'Amend the bill by striking out everything after the title and inserting the following:

**Sec. 1. Department of Education to report on school Internet and student
data collection best practices. Resolved:** That, no later than January 15, 2025, the
Department of Education shall submit to the joint standing committee of the Legislature
having jurisdiction over education matters a report on school Internet and student data
collection policies and efforts to ensure that the State is using best practices, including but
not limited to ensuring that schools are using appropriate Internet and digital media filtering
hardware and software, that student data and information are not being divulged to Internet-
based applications or search engines such as Google or other similar products and that
monitoring or other tracking software and data are not being used or collected from devices
used by or provided to students. The report must include findings on best practices and
recommendations, including suggested legislation, on ensuring schools are using these best
practices. The joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over
education matters may report out a bill related to the report to the 132nd Legislature in
2025.

appropriations and allocations are made.

SUMMARY

This amendment amends Committee Amendment "A" to change the date by which the Department of Education must submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs in the 131st Legislature, instead requiring that the department issue the report no later than January 15, 2025 to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education matters.

This amendment also replaces the appropriations and allocations section to move the available funding from fiscal year 2023-24 to fiscal year 2024-25.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This amendment moves the one-time General Fund appropriation of \$5,000 to the Learning Systems program within the Department of Education for the costs associated with preparing a report on school internet and student data collection best practices from fiscal year 2023-24 to fiscal year 2024-25 and changes the report date from January 15, 2024 to January 15, 2025.
