11 12	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and inserting the following:
13 14	'Sec. 1. 12 MRSA 30206, sub-3, C, as amended by PL 2019, c. 264, 1, is further amended to read:

All revenues collected under the provisions of this Part relating to watercraft, including chapter 935, including fines, fees and other available money deposited with the Treasurer of State, must be distributed as undedicated revenue to the General Fund and the Department of Marine Resources according to a formula that is jointly agreed upon by the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and the Commissioner of Marine Resources biannually that pays to the department the administrative costs of the Division of Licensing and Registration. The Legislature shall appropriate to the department in each fiscal year an amount equal to the administrative costs incurred by the department in collecting revenue under this subsection. Those costs must be verified by the Department of Marine Resources and the Department of Administrative costs and after allowing for any necessary year-end reconciliation and accounting distribution must be allocated 75% to the department and 25% to the Department of Marine Resources and approved by the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of the Budget.

3. Nonresident motorboat and personal watercraft lake and river protection sticker and resident and nonresident seaplane lake and river protection sticker; fee. No later than January 1st of each year, the commissioner shall provide the agents authorized to register watercraft or issue licenses with a sufficient quantity of lake and river protection stickers for motorboats and personal watercraft not registered in the State and for all seaplanes, whether or not registered in the State, for that boating season. The sticker must be in 2 parts so that one part of the sticker can be affixed to each side of the bow of a motorboat or personal watercraft or to each outside edge of a seaplane's pontoons. Prior to January 1, 2020, the fee for a sticker issued under this subsection is \$20, \$1 of which is retained by the agent who sold the sticker. Beginning January 1, 2020, the fee for a sticker issued under this subsection is \$35, \$1 of which is retained by the agent who sold the sticker. Beginning January 1, 2022, the fee for a sticker issued under this subsection is \$45, \$1 of which is retained by the agent who sold the sticker. Beginning January 1, 2025, the fee for a sticker issued under this subsection is \$60, \$1 of which is retained by the agent who sold the sticker. Beginning January 1, 2028, the fee for a sticker issued under this subsection is \$75, \$1 of which is retained by the agent who sold the sticker.

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SUMMARY

This amendment, which replaces the bill, increases the fees for new or renewal certificates of number for resident motorboats and personal watercraft and the fees for lake and river protection stickers for all motorboats and personal watercraft not registered in the State and for seaplanes operating on inland waters of the State. Beginning January 1, 2025, the fees for certificates of number are increased by \$10 and the fees for lake and river protection stickers are increased by \$15 and, beginning January 1, 2028, the fees are increased by an additional \$10 for certificates of number and by an additional \$15 for lake and river protection stickers. The amendment also makes a change to how fees are allocated so that, beginning January 1, 2025, 70% of fees are credited to the Invasive Aquatic Plant and Nuisance Species Fund, rather than 80% as in current law, and 30% of fees, rather than 20% as in current law, are credited to the Lake and River Protection Fund.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

Beginning January 1, 2025, this bill increases the portion of the fees paid when registering watercraft for operating on the inland waters of the State from \$15 to \$25 for invasive species prevention and control. The bill also increases the fee paid for lake and river protection stickers required for nonresident motorboats, personal watercraft and seaplanes operating on inland waters of the State from \$45 to \$60. Beginning January 1, 2028, these fees increase from \$25 to \$35 for resident and from \$60 to \$75 for nonresidents. The bill also changes references in statute so that all revenues from the sale of lake and river protection stickers are divided 70% to the Invasive Aquatic Plant and Nuisance Species Fund within the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and 30% to the Lake and River Protection Fund within the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife (IFW).

The increased invasive species prevention and control fees will generate revenue of \$533,345 for the IFW and \$628,342 for the DEP for the fiscal years 2024-25 through 2026-27. These amounts will increase again as the new higher prices come into effect in fiscal year 2027-28. This estimate was generated by using the average number of registrations and annual revenues to both funds. The bill includes allocations of those amounts to the IFW and the DEP to allow expenditure of the additional revenue.
