2	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA c. 256-B is enacted to read:
3	CHAPTER 256-B
4	ADVERSE CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES
5	§1431. Training regarding and screening for adverse childhood experiences
6	A health care provider licensed under Title 32, chapter 31, 36 or 48:
7 8 9	1. Training required. Must receive training on adverse childhood experiences and resources in the State for survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault as part of the provider's requirements for licensure; and
10 11 12	2. Screening required. Shall screen all patients 18 years of age or older for adverse childhood experiences at annual physical exams and at the time behavioral or reproductive health services are provided.

14 15 16 17 18	This bill requires a health care provider licensed under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 32, chapter 31, 36 or 48 to receive training on adverse childhood experiences and resources in the State for survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault as part of the provider's requirements for licensure and screen all patients 18 years of age or older for adverse childhood experiences at annual physical exams and at the time behavioral or reproductive health services are provided.
