1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3174-KKK is enacted to read:
3	§3174-KKK. Reimbursement supplement for certain behavioral health services
4 5 6	The department shall provide to a provider a supplement to reimbursement for behavioral health services to address the behavioral health of MaineCare members in accordance with this section.
7 8 9	1. Application. This section applies to behavioral health services that are part of a nationally recognized model supported by evidence-based research and delivered with model fidelity. The services described by this section include, but are not limited to:
10	A. Assertive community treatment;
11	B. Eye movement desensitization and reprocessing:
12	C. Trauma-focused cognitive behavioral therapy;
13 14	D. Multisystemic therapy, including multisystemic therapy for problematic sexual behavior;
15	E. So-called attachment and biobehavioral catch-up;
16	F. Adolescent community reinforcement approach; and
17	G. Dialectical behavioral therapy.
18 19	2. Amount. A supplement provided under this section for a service must be in an amount equal to 30% of the reimbursement amount for that service.

21	§3016. Behavioral health services
22 23 24	When contracting for behavioral health services, the department shall contract with providers who provide behavioral health services that are part of a nationally recognized model supported by evidence-based research and delivered with model fidelity.
