1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 15 MRSA c. 521 is enacted to read:
3	CHAPTER 521
4	RIGHTS OF SEXUAL ASSAULT SURVIVORS
5	§6201. Definitions
6	For the purposes of this chapter, the following terms have the following meanings.
7 8	1. Law enforcement officer. "Law enforcement officer" has the same meaning as in Title 25, section 2801 A, subsection 5.
9 10	2. Sexual assault counselor. "Sexual assault counselor" has the same meaning as in Title 16, section 53-A, subsection 1, paragraph B.
11	3. Sexual assault survivor. "Sexual assault survivor" or "survivor" means:
12	A. An adult who is a victim of a crime described in:
13	(1) Title 17-A, chapter 11;
14	(2) Title 17-A, section 511-A; or
15	(3) Title 17-A, section 852 or 853; or
16	B. A minor who is a victim of a crime described in:
17	(1) Title 17-A, chapter 11;
18	(2) Title 17-A, section 511-A;
19	(3) Title 17-A, section 852 or 853; or
20	(4) Title 17-A, section 282 or 283.
21	§6202. Right to a sexual assault counselor and a support person
22 23 24 25 26	A survivor has the right to consult with a sexual assault counselor during any physical examination and has the right to have a sexual assault counselor or support person of the survivor's choosing present during any interview by a law enforcement officer, prosecutor or defense attorney. A survivor retains this right even if the survivor has waived the right in a previous examination or interview.
27	§6203. Prohibition on use of evidence gathered during sexual assault forensic
28 29	examination  Evidence gathered during a sexual assault forensic examination may not be used to
30 31 32	prosecute a survivor for any Class D or Class E crime or for any crime under Title 17-A, chapter 45, and evidence gathered during a sexual assault forensic examination may not be used as a basis to search for further evidence of any unrelated Class D or Class E crime or

## SUMMARY

This bill specifies that a sexual assault survivor has the right to consult with a sexual
assault counselor during any physical examination and has the right to have a sexual assault
counselor or support person of the survivor's choosing present during any interview by a
law enforcement officer, prosecutor or defense attorney. A survivor retains this right even
if the survivor has waived the right in a previous examination or interview. The bill also
prohibits evidence gathered during a sexual assault forensic examination from being used
to prosecute a survivor for any Class D or Class E crime or for any crime under the Maine
Revised Statutes, Title 17-A, chapter 45. Evidence gathered during a sexual assault forensic
examination may also not be used as a basis to search for further evidence of any unrelated
Class D or Class E crime or for any crime under Title 17-A, chapter 45 that may have been
committed by the survivor.
