### **An Act to Provide Self-service Motor Vehicle Services in Rural and Other Areas**

1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §160** is enacted to read:

3 **§160. Motor vehicle services**

4 The Secretary of State shall establish and operate 8 self-service kiosks that provide, to  
5 the maximum extent feasible, at least the following services:

6 **1. Vehicle registration.** Vehicle registration renewal pursuant to chapter 5,  
7 subchapter 1; and

8 **2. Licenses or identification cards.** Renewal or replacement for a driver's license or  
9 nondriver identification card under chapter 11.

10 The Secretary of State shall locate some of the self-service kiosks in rural areas that  
11 are an inconvenient distance from offices that can provide services under this section.

12 **SUMMARY**

13 This bill requires the Secretary of State to establish and operate 8 self-service kiosks to  
14 provide vehicle registration renewals and renewals or replacements of driver's licenses or  
15 nondriver identification cards. The Secretary of State must place some of the self-service  
16 kiosks in rural areas.
