SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the minority report of the committee, changes the title and replaces the bill. The amendment prohibits a school employee from providing a prescription or nonprescription drug or medical device to a minor student without parental consent and from referring a minor student to a health care professional, including a mental health professional, without parental consent. The prohibitions in the amendment do not apply in an "emergency," which is defined to mean circumstances involving an immediate risk to life or an immediate risk of serious bodily injury.
