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Amend the bill by striking out all of sections 2 and 3 and inserting the following

 'Sec. 2. Subsidy program development. The Maine State Housing Authority, referred to in this section as "the authority," shall develop a rental subsidy program for homeless students in coordination with the Department of Education and the Department of Health and Human Services and other agencies or service providers as the authority determines appropriate. The authority shall consider ways in which the services provided by school-based housing navigators established by the federal McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act could benefit the administration of a rental subsidy program. The program must provide housing subsidies directly to homeless students or to an adult family member or guardian of the homeless student. In developing the program, the authority must incorporate elements to provide housing subsidies to homeless students who have not attained 18 years of age who do not have adult family members or guardians to secure housing on their behalf. The authority shall report to the joint standing or joint select committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over housing matters on the progress of the program's development no later than January 15, 2024

30 SUMMARY

This amendment removes the portions of the bill that direct the Maine State Housing Authority to identify 3 sites in the State to be used for site-based housing for homeless students and also removes the associated one-time funding of \$3.5 million in fiscal years 2023-24 and 2024-25. The bill requires the authority to establish a voucher program for homeless students, the amendment changes that to a housing subsidy program. The amendment adds a directive that the authority develop the housing subsidy program in consultation with the Department of Education and the Department of Health and Human Services. The program must incorporate elements to provide housing subsidies to homeless students who have not attained 18 years of age who do not have adult family members or guardians to secure housing for them. Under the amendment, the authority is required to report on the progress of the program's development no later than January 15, 2024. The

### Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill includes one-time General Fund appropriations of \$2,000,000 in fiscal years 2023-24 and 2024-25 only to a newly established Housing Subsidy Program for Homeless Students within the Maine State Housing Authority (MSHA) to provide housing subsidies to homeless students in elementary and secondary school

Additional costs to the Department of Education and to the Department of Health and Human Services to coordinate with MSHA in the development of the rental subsidy program can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources
