1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	<b>Sec. 1. 35-A MRSA §301, sub-§4,</b> as amended by PL 1993, c. 506, §1, is further amended to read:
4	4. Determining rates. In determining just and reasonable rates, the commission:
5 6	A. Shall provide such revenues to the utility as may be required to perform its public service and to attract necessary capital on just and reasonable terms; and
7 8 9	B. Shall, to a level within the commission's discretion, consider whether the utility is operating as efficiently as possible and is utilizing sound management practices, including the treatment in rates of executive compensation-; and
10 11 12 13 14 15 16	C. May consider the ability of low-income residential ratepayers to pay the rates and may design rates to be affordable to low-income residential ratepayers. For the purposes of this paragraph, "low-income residential ratepayer" means a residential customer receiving benefits under a state or federal low-income assistance program or whose family income is equal to or below 200% of the nonfarm income official poverty line as defined by the federal Office of Management and Budget and revised annually in accordance with the United States Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981, Section 673, Subsection 2.
18	SUMMARY
19 20	This bill authorizes the Public Utilities Commission to consider the ability of low-income residential ratepayers to pay when determining just and reasonable rates.
