1 **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and 3 Whereas, this legislation is needed to immediately remove the requirements for prior 4 authorization and step therapy for medications used to treat serious mental illness, 5 requirements that create unnecessary and potentially devastating interruptions in patient care and unnecessary burdens for health care providers and that have the unintentional 6 7 effect of more costly and catastrophic outcomes; and 8 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within 9 the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as 10 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 11 therefore, 12 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3174-KKK is enacted to read: 13 14 §3174-KKK. Treatment of serious mental illness 15 1. **Definitions.** For purposes of this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings. 16 17 A. "Serious mental illness" means a mental disorder listed in the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders published in 2022 by the American Psychiatric 18 19 Association that results in serious functional impairment that substantially interferes with or limits one or more major life activities. 20 21 B. "Step therapy protocol" means a protocol or tiered program that establishes a specific sequence in which prescription drugs for a specified medical condition are 22 23 medically necessary for a particular MaineCare member and are covered under this 24 chapter, including self-administered and physician-administered drugs. 25 2. Prior authorization or step therapy protocol. The department may not require 26 under the MaineCare program prior authorization or a step therapy protocol for prescription drugs used for the assessment or treatment of serious mental illness, except that the 27 department may impose a prior authorization requirement for a dosage increase that 28 exceeds the department's dosing criteria as identified on the department's MaineCare 29 30 preferred drug list. 31 3. Medicaid. The implementation of this section and rules adopted pursuant to this section must be consistent with the requirements of the Medicaid drug rebate program. 32 33 4. Rules. The department may adopt rules to implement this section. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, 34 35 subchapter 2-A. 36 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved. 37 SUMMARY 38 39 This bill prohibits prior authorization requirements and step therapy protocols under the MaineCare program for prescription drugs used to assess or treat serious mental illness. 40

The implementation of the prohibition must be consistent with the requirements of the Medicaid drug rebate program.
