An Act to Address Poverty by Increasing Access to Energy Efficiency and Weatherization Programs

Presented by Representative WARREN of Scarborough. Cosponsored by Representative: Speaker TALBOT ROSS of Portland. 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §577-A, sub-§10, as enacted by PL 2019, c. 476, §9, is amended to read:

10. Report. Beginning January 15, 2021, and annually thereafter, the council shall submit a report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over environment and natural resources matters describing the activities of the council, the subcommittee and its working groups over the prior calendar year and including any findings and recommendations of the council, including any proposed legislation. The report must include specific recommendations to assist low-income residents of the State. After reviewing the report, the joint standing committee may report out legislation to implement any recommendations contained in the report.

12 Sec. 2. Rules relating to home energy assistance programs. The Department 13 of Health and Human Services, the Maine State Housing Authority and the Efficiency 14 Maine Trust shall amend their rules as necessary to ensure that the Home Energy Assistance 15 Program and federal Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program resources are 16 distributed in the most expedited manner possible.

17 Sec. 3. Rules relating to energy efficiency programs. The Efficiency Maine Trust and the Maine State Housing Authority shall amend their rules as necessary to more 18 fully address the needs of low-income individuals relating to energy efficiency programs, 19 including, but not limited to, by amending their rules to remove the term "low-income" 20 from home energy assistance program materials, add cooling pumps to references to 21 22 heating pumps and authorize mobile homes built after 1976 to qualify for weatherization 23 assistance programs. The Efficiency Maine Trust and the Maine State Housing Authority shall consult each other and the Maine Climate Council in the adoption of rules pursuant 24 25 to this section. The Efficiency Maine Trust and the Maine State Housing Authority shall 26 jointly submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Energy, Utilities and Technology no later than December 6, 2023 with recommendations, including suggested 27 28 legislation, for any statutory changes needed to implement this section.

Sec. 4. Rules relating to energy efficiency and weatherization services. The Efficiency Maine Trust and the Maine State Housing Authority shall amend their rules as necessary to prioritize programming that combines energy efficiency and weatherization services, including prioritizing the distribution of state funds, private funds and bond measures for that programming and requiring energy auditors to recommend sustainable heating solutions, including heating and cooling pumps.

Sec. 5. Rules relating to weatherization assistance programs and social services. The Efficiency Maine Trust and the Maine State Housing Authority shall amend their rules to combine weatherization assistance programs with social services, when reasonable and feasible, in circumstances that result in a net savings of state funds and that advance social equity.

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SUMMARY

This bill requires the Maine Climate Council to include in its annual report specific recommendations to assist low-income residents of the State. The bill also directs the Department of Health and Human Services, the Maine State Housing Authority and the
