Resolve, to Establish the Task Force on Cannabis Hospitality Establishments

Reference to the Committee on Veterans and Legal Affairs suggested and ordered printed.

- **Sec. 1. Task force established. Resolved:** That the Task Force on Cannabis Hospitality Establishments, referred to in this resolve as "the task force," is established.
 - **Sec. 2. Task force membership. Resolved:** Notwithstanding Joint Rule 353, that the task force consists of 17 members appointed as follows:
 - 1. Four members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate, including members from each of the 2 parties holding the largest number of seats in the Legislature;
 - 2. Four members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House, including members from each of the 2 parties holding the largest number of seats in the Legislature;
 - 3. The following members appointed by the President of the Senate:
 - A. One supporter of the 2016 cannabis legalization ballot measure;
- B. One expert on cannabis policy;

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- C. One expert on training for alcohol industry employees;
- D. One member representing the interests of adult use cannabis consumers; and
- E. One member representing the interests of municipal governments; and
- 4. The following members appointed by the Speaker of the House:
- 17 A. One member representing the interests of adult use cannabis licensees;
 - B. One member representing the interests of the hospitality industry;
 - C. One member representing law enforcement; and
- D. One member representing public health.
 - **Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved:** That the first-named Senate member is the Senate chair and the first-named House of Representatives member is the House chair of the task force.
 - **Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of task force. Resolved:** That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all appointments have been completed. After appointment of all members, the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the task force. If 30 days or more after the effective date of this resolve a majority of but not all appointments have been made, the chairs may request authority and the Legislative Council may grant authority for the task force to meet and conduct its business.
 - **Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved:** That the task force shall review how other states regulate cannabis hospitality establishments and draft recommendations for a bill to regulate cannabis hospitality establishments in this State. These recommendations must address issues including, but not limited to:
 - 1. Whether the State should issue a single cannabis hospitality establishment license or various license types for different business models;
 - 2. The qualifications for obtaining a cannabis hospitality establishment license and how applications will be reviewed;

3. Ensuring compliance with existing cannabis laws and regulations, including 1 2 identification requirements, seed-to-sale tracking and product recalls; 3 4. Purchase and consumption limitations for patrons; 4 5. How different methods of consumption are to be regulated; 5 6. What other products or services, including food or entertainment, may be offered at cannabis hospitality establishments; 6 Preventing the consumption of alcohol and tobacco at cannabis hospitality 7 8 establishments; 9 8. Preventing overconsumption and operating under the influence; 10 9. Preventing disturbances to neighboring businesses or residences; 11 10. Exemptions from the laws relating to clean indoor air; 12 11. Training for cannabis hospitality establishment employees; and 12. Local control, including whether municipalities need to opt in or opt out of 13 allowing cannabis hospitality establishments and how municipalities may regulate them. 14 15 Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the Legislative Council shall provide necessary staffing services to the task force, except that Legislative Council staff support 16 17 is not authorized when the Legislature is in regular or special session. 18 Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That, no later than December 6, 2023, the task force shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested 19 20 legislation, for presentation to the Joint Standing Committee on Veterans and Legal Affairs 21 for the Second Regular Session of the 131st Legislature.

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This resolve establishes the Task Force on Cannabis Hospitality Establishments. The task force is directed to submit a report and any suggested legislation to the Joint Standing Committee on Veterans and Legal Affairs by December 6, 2023.
