1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	<b>Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §108, sub-§2,</b> ¶C, as amended by PL 2007, c. 173, §24, is further amended by amending subparagraph (3) to read:
4	(3) The person knows that the person or a 3rd person can, with complete safety:
5 6 7	(a) Retreat from the encounter, except that the person or the 3rd person is not required to retreat if the person or the 3rd person is in the person's dwelling place and was not the initial aggressor;
8 9	(b) Surrender property to a person asserting a colorable claim of right thereto; or.
10 11	(c) Comply with a demand that the person abstain from performing an act that the person is not obliged to perform.
12	SUMMARY
13 14 15	This bill removes the duty of a person exercising self-defense in an encounter to, if the person can do so safely, retreat from the encounter or comply with a demand to abstain from performing an act that the person is not obliged to perform before using deadly force.
