34 This amendment, which is a minority report of the committee, removes provisions from
35 the bill establishing program standards that require 30% of individuals in the substance use
36 disorder treatment program to no longer need medication-assisted treatment or alternative
37 treatment after participating in the program for up to 6 months and establishing the
38 requirement that the contract for that program be cancelled if those standards are not met
39 The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section

Fiscal Detail and Notes

The bill includes General Fund appropriations to the Department of Health and Human Services of \$2,651,080 in fiscal year 2023-24 and \$3,504,619 in fiscal year 2024-25 to provide recovery residence placements to individuals who were receiving services in correctional facilities and have been identified as no longer requiring medication-assisted treatment or alternative treatment, including weekly screening, and to establish one Comprehensive Health Planner II position

The bill includes General Fund appropriations of \$5,935,135 beginning in fiscal year 2024-25 to the Department of Corrections for medical and other costs related to providing alternative treatments in correctional facilities for a person with substance use disorder, including alcohol use disorder
