**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

**Whereas,** during the COVID-19 pandemic, the Federal Government increased the level of benefits available under the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, or SNAP; and

Whereas, those extended benefits are scheduled to expire March 1, 2023; and

Whereas, due to rising costs of food and other necessities of living, the sudden termination of these benefits creates a crisis for families that depend on the extended benefits; and

Whereas, in order to avoid that crisis, the level of benefits under SNAP needs to be restored as soon as possible and recipients given a chance to adjust to a lower level of benefits; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

**Sec. 1. Appropriations and allocations.** The following appropriations and allocations are made.

#### HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES, DEPARTMENT OF

#### Food Supplement Administration Z019

Initiative: Provides a one-time appropriation for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program benefit payments to continue for 6 months, replacing the expiring COVID-19 emergency benefit allotments under the federal Families First Coronavirus Response Act. The one-time appropriation will allow for an extension to the emergency benefits previously provided by the Federal Government with General Fund funding for the following 6 months of 2023 at the following levels: March, 100% of the previous federal emergency benefit level; April, 75% of the previous federal emergency benefit level; May, 50% of the previous federal emergency benefit level; and June through August, 25% of the previous federal emergency benefit level.

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved.

37 SUMMARY

Under the federal Families First Coronavirus Response Act, the Federal Government provided emergency benefit allotments under the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance

- Program, or SNAP. These emergency benefit allotments are scheduled to expire March 1, 2023.
- This bill extends for 6 months, but on a decreasing basis, the amount of benefits available under SNAP by providing General Fund funds to provide the following level of benefits:
  - 1. In March 2023, 100% of the federal emergency benefit allotment;
    - 2. In April 2023, 75% of the federal emergency benefit allotment;
- 8 3. In May 2023, 50% of the federal emergency benefit allotment; and

- 9 4. From June through August 2023, 25% of the federal emergency benefit allotment.
- Beginning in September 2023, an additional amount is not provided.
