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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to S P 640, L D 1608 (S-128)

SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, removes the provisions of the bill amending the Educators for Maine Program and, instead of providing funding for a Maine teacher residency program at the University of Southern Maine through the Department of Education, funds the program through the University of Maine System The amendment also removes the requirement that the Maine Education Policy Research Institute include suggested legislation in its report to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill includes ongoing General Fund appropriations of \$1,000,000 per year beginning in fiscal year 2024-25 to the Educational and General Activities program within the University of Maine System to support the Maine Teacher Residency Program at the University of Southern Maine

The bill requires the Maine Education Policy Research Institute to study the development of career ladders for educators and report its findings and recommendations to the Legislature by December 6, 2023 Maine Revised Statutes Annotated, Title 20-A, section 10 established the Education Research Institute to collect and analyze education information and perform targeted education research for the Legislature The Legislature contracts with the University of Maine System to maintain the institute and ongoing General Fund appropriations of \$250,000 per year are included in the Learning Systems Team program account within the Department of Education to support the work of the institute This fiscal note assumes that the intent is that the study be paid for with the funding included in the Learning Systems Team budget for fiscal year 2023-24 and enacted in Public Law 2023, chapter 17 and that the cost of the study will not exceed the \$250,000 already appropriated for fiscal year 2023-24 Given these assumptions, no additional General Fund appropriations are included in this bill for this purpose
