Sec. 1. Department of Marine Resources to convene working group. **Resolved:** That the Department of Marine Resources shall convene a working group to develop a long-term plan to support the lobster industry. The department shall invite participation in the working group from at least the following: members of the lobster industry; local officials from towns with significant lobster industry activity; experts on the lobster industry and federal regulation of the lobster industry; and the Attorney General or the Attorney General's designee. The working group shall review and develop recommendations relating to the lobster industry, including, but not limited to, state and federal regulation, infrastructure needs, waterfront access, climate change concerns and marketing of the industry. By December 6, 2023, the department shall submit an interim report and recommendations, including any suggested legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources. The committee may report out legislation related to the interim report to the Second Regular Session of the 131st Legislature. By November 6, 2024, the department shall submit a final report and recommendations, including any suggested legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources. The joint standing committee having jurisdiction over marine resources matters may report out legislation related to the final report to the 132nd Legislature in 2025.
