Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:		
Sec. 1. 3 MRSA c. 39 is enacted to read:		
CHAPTER 39		
LODGING FOR LEGISLATORS AUTHORITY		
§1111. Definitions		
As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.		
1. Authority. "Authority" means the Lodging for Legislators Authority established under section 1112.		
2. Board. "Board" means the Lodging for Legislators Board under section 1113.		
3. Lodging facility. "Lodging facility" means a hotel or other lodging facility, including but not limited to a facility with studio apartments, located near the State House, that is suitable for providing temporary lodging for Legislators. A lodging facility may include space within the facility that provides food or beverages or other services to persons lodging in the facility.		
<u>§1112. Authority</u>		
The Lodging for Legislators Authority is established as a public body corporate and politic and an instrumentality of the State to develop and manage a lodging facility.		
1. Powers and duties. The authority shall develop and manage a lodging facility in accordance with this chapter. In carrying out this responsibility, the authority may:		
A. Sue and be sued;		
B. Have a seal and alter it at the authority's pleasure;		
C. Construct, maintain or otherwise manage lodging facilities for members of the Legislature;		
D. Make and execute contracts and other instruments necessary or convenient for carrying out the purposes of this chapter;		
E. Borrow money necessary or convenient for carrying out the purposes of this chapter. Any notes, obligations or liabilities of the authority are not a debt of the State or a pledge of the faith and credit of the State but are payable exclusively from funds provided to or obtained by the authority pursuant to this chapter;		
<u>F. Purchase, sell, mortgage, lease or rent property necessary or convenient for carrying out the purposes of this chapter;</u>		
<u>G. Exercise any other powers necessary or convenient for carrying out the purposes of this chapter; and</u>		
<u>H. Adopt, amend and repeal bylaws not inconsistent with this chapter to carry into effect the powers and purposes of the authority.</u>		
<u>§1113. Administration</u>		

1 2	1. Board. The authority is governed by the Lodging for Legislators Board, as established in Title 5, section 12004-F, subsection 19.		
3	A. The board consists of the following 7 members:		
4	(1) The State Treasurer;		
5	(2) Three members appointed by the President of the Senate; and		
6	(3) Three members appointed by the Speaker of the House.		
7	B. Appointed members of the board serve 4-year terms and may be reappointed.		
8	C. Four members of the board constitute a quorum.		
9 10 11 12 13	2. Director. The board shall appoint, using a full and competitive search process, a qualified full-time director of the authority. The director serves at the pleasure of the board. The director must have demonstrated experience relevant to the purposes of the authority. The board shall establish the rate and amount of compensation of the director and all other employees of the authority. The director:		
14	A. Serves as the president of the authority;		
15	B. Is responsible for:		
16	(1) Establishing an office for the authority;		
17 18	(2) Hiring and organizing staff for the authority and determining their qualifications and duties; and		
19 20	(3) Managing the authority's work and performing other duties as the board considers appropriate; and		
21 22	C. May delegate to employees of the authority any powers and duties that the director considers proper.		
23	<u>§1114. Lodging for Legislators</u>		
24 25	The authority shall develop and manage a lodging facility in accordance with this section.		
26 27 28	1. Development. To the extent of available funding, the authority shall develop a cost-effective lodging facility with a goal of making the facility available for members of the Legislature by January 2025.		
29 30 31	2. Rents. The rental fee for Legislators at the lodging facility must be equal to the housing allowance under section 2. The rental rate for any other person must be a market rate. All rental proceeds must be deposited in the fund.		
32 33 34	3. Lease. The authority may lease space in the lodging facility to other entities to provide food or beverages or other services to persons lodging in the facility. All lease payments must be deposited in the fund.		
35 36 37 38	4. Fund. The Lodging Fund, referred to in this section as "the fund," is established within the authority. The fund is nonlapsing and receives all appropriations or allocations made to the fund and all other revenue received by the authority, including but not limited to the proceeds of loans and all lease and rental fees.

The Lodging for Legislators Board shall evaluate the costs of various options for developing a lodging facility pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, chapter 39, including but not limited to by purchasing, leasing or renovating an existing facility. The board shall evaluate the costs of the options over a 30-year period relative to the costs to the State of the housing allowance paid to Legislators over the same time period under Title 3, section 2 and shall adopt a plan for implementing the option the board finds to be most cost-effective. The authority shall make a report of its findings to the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs by January 15, 2024, including an estimate of the amount of funding necessary to proceed with the option the authority has chosen.
