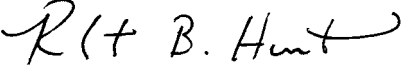

### **An Act to Regulate the Operation of Micromobility Devices on Public Ways**

1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 29-A MRS §101, sub-§33-A** is enacted to read:

3 **33-A. Micromobility device.** "Micromobility device" means a small, low-speed  
4 human-powered or electric-powered transportation device, including a scooter, skateboard,  
5 electric scooter, electric skateboard or other lightweight, wheeled conveyance that has a  
6 speed of 28 miles per hour or less. "Micromobility device" does not include a bicycle, an  
7 electric bicycle or a conveyance powered by an internal combustion engine.

8 **Sec. 2. 29-A MRS §2063, sub-§1,** as amended by PL 2019, c. 349, §6, is further  
9 amended to read:

10 **1. Definitions.** For the purpose of this section, "bicycle" includes a motorized bicycle,  
11 a motorized tricycle, a motorized scooter ~~and~~, an electric bicycle and a micromobility  
12 device.

13 **Sec. 3. 29-A MRS §2322, sub-§1,** as enacted by PL 1999, c. 331, §1, is amended  
14 to read:

15 **1. Bicycle.** "Bicycle" means a vehicle primarily propelled by human power, operated  
16 by a person usually seated on a seat and driven on the ground on wheels by the operator.  
17 "Bicycle" includes a micromobility device except with regard to special regulations and to  
18 provisions in this chapter that by their nature can have no application to vehicles other than  
19 bicycles.

## 20 **SUMMARY**

21 This bill defines a micromobility device as a small, low-speed human-powered or  
22 electric-powered transportation device, including a scooter, skateboard, electric scooter,  
23 electric skateboard or other lightweight, wheeled conveyance that has a speed of 28 miles  
24 per hour or less. This bill applies the rules of the road and helmet standards to  
25 micromobility devices as the rules and standards are applied to bicycles.
