Fiscal Detail and Notes

The Office of Cannabis Policy (OCP) within the Department of Administrative and Financial Services has indicated that current staff does not have the necessary criminal law expertise to conduct a review of the relevant sections of the Maine Criminal Code and the Maine Revised Statutes within the timeline required by the bill. The bill includes a one-time General Fund appropriation of \$200,000 to OCP in fiscal year 2024-25 for contracted legal services.

Any additional costs to the Department of Public Safety associatied with serving on a stakeholder group can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
