1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA c. 9, sub-c. 7 is enacted to read:
3	SUBCHAPTER 7
4	ELECTION FUNDING
5	<u>§871. Private funding prohibited</u>
6 7	1. Short title. This section may be known and cited as "the Prohibition on the Private Funding of Elections Act."
8 9	2. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
10	A. "Election" means an election held to nominate or elect a candidate to a public office.
11 12 13 14	B. "Person" means an individual, proprietorship, firm, partnership, joint venture, syndicate, labor union, business trust, company, association, committee or corporation, whether or not operated for profit, or any other organization or group of persons acting in concert or any other nongovernmental 3rd-party entity.
15 16	C. "Public funds" means funds derived from taxes, fees and other sources of public revenue lawfully appropriated by the Legislature.
17 18 19 20 21	3. Prohibition on private funds. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, a public official may not solicit, take or otherwise accept from any person a contribution, donation or anything else of value for purposes of conducting state or local elections. All costs and expenses relating to state or local elections must be paid for with public funds.
22 23 24	4. Construction. This section may not be construed to apply to the donation or use of a location for voting purposes, services that are provided without remuneration or goods that have a nominal value of less than \$100.
25	5. Violation. A violation of this section is a Class C crime.
26	SUMMARY
27 28 29 30 31	This bill provides that a public official may not solicit, take or otherwise accept from any person a contribution, donation or anything else of value for purposes of conducting state or local elections. It requires that all costs and expenses relating to state or local elections must be paid for with public funds. A violation of the prohibition is a Class C crime.
