HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1224,
L.D. 1908, "An Act to Enact the Safe Cosmetics Act"

Amend the amendment in section 1 in c. 37 in §3302 by striking out all of subsection
1 (page 1, lines 21 to 26 in amendment) and inserting the following:


'1. Cosmetic product. "Cosmetic product" means an article for retail sale or
professional use intended to be rubbed, poured, sprinkled or sprayed on, introduced into or
otherwise applied to the human body for cleansing, beautifying, promoting attractiveness
or altering the appearance. "Cosmetic product" does not include:

- A. Soap;
- B. Dietary supplements; or
- C. Food and drugs regulated by the United States Food and Drug Administration.'

Amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or
section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment amends Committee Amendment "A" to clarify that the term "cosmetic
product" does not include food and drugs regulated by the United States Food and Drug
Administration, instead of food and prescription drugs approved by the United States Food
and Drug Administration as in the committee amendment.
