4 5	E. Except as provided in subsection 13-A, the lease does not result in a person being a tenant of any kind in leases covering an aggregate of more than 500 acres; and

8	F. No single lease may exceed 100 acres in size-;

A lease may not be issued for marine finfish aquaculture if the stocking density exceeds 22 kilograms per cubic meter, except that the department and the Department of Environmental Protection may establish lower limits via permit conditions or adopt routine technical rules, as described in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A, that set a lower limit. A lease that is in effect on the effective date of this paragraph must abide by these limits upon renewal of the lease; and

A lease may not be issued for marine finfish aquaculture if the biomass exceeds 780 metric tons, except that the department and the Department of Environmental Protection may adopt routine technical rules, as described in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A, that set a lower limit. A lease that is in effect on the effective date of this paragraph must abide by these limits upon renewal of the lease. The department and the Department of Environmental Protection may adopt routine technical rules to set lower biomass limits on a regional basis or via permit conditions.

25 26 27 28	This bill provides that the Commissioner of Marine Resources may not issue a lease for marine finfish aquaculture if the stocking density exceeds 22 kilograms per cubic meter or if the biomass exceeds 780 metric tons and that existing leases must abide by these limits upon renewal.
