The stakeholder group shall examine the problem of children and adolescents experiencing long stays in hospital emergency departments after the children and adolescents are medically stable and no longer require medical treatment but appropriate community or residential placements are not available. The stakeholder group shall examine and make recommendations relating to the following:	
21 22	A. An appropriate timeline for establishing a secure children's psychiatric residential treatment facility in the State;	
23 24	B. Strategies to limit the length of stay in hospital emergency departments for children and adolescents who have been medically cleared for discharge;	
25	C. The establishment of an independent children's behavioral health advocate; and

The department shall submit a report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters with its findings and recommendations no later than November 6, 2024. The committee may report out legislation to the 132nd Legislature in 2025.

36 37 38 39	This amendment replaces the bill with a resolve. It requires the Department of Health and Human Services to convene a stakeholder group to address the problem of children and adolescents experiencing long stays in hospital emergency departments after the children and adolescents are medically stable and no longer require medical treatment but	

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appropriate community or residential placements are not available. The Commissioner of Health and Human Services must appoint the members of the stakeholder group, which must include representatives from offices within the department and organizations dealing with child welfare, behavioral health and medicine in addition to affected parents and other interested parties. The department must submit a report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters no later than November 6, 2024.
