An Act Regarding Spirits Price Regulation

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	Sec. 1. 28-A MRSA §83-C, sub-§2, as amended by PL 2021, c. 658, §54, is further amended to read:

Make recommendations to the commission regarding the retail prices of spirits sold in the State and establish Establish the wholesale and retail prices of spirits sold in this State. The bureau shall adopt rules regarding the wholesale pricing of spirits and the retail pricing of spirits sold to by agency liquor stores. The wholesale spirits provider is granted the privilege to distribute spirits under this Title and is immune from antitrust action so long as the wholesale spirits provider is in compliance with the bureau's rules and all other applicable laws and regulations; Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are major substantive rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A. In adopting rules establishing prices under this subsection, the bureau shall: A. Seek to ensure the bureau receives sufficient, but not excessive, revenues to meet the requirements of this Title; B. Seek to ensure equitable prices for similar products across product price and bottle
16 17	size: C. Seek to ensure equitable price markups based on product price or bottle size; and

21 22	This bill is reported out by the Joint Standing Committee on Veterans and Legal Affairs pursuant to Public Law 2021, chapter 622.
23 24 25 26 27 28	The bill removes the provision in current law directing the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages and Lottery Operations to make recommendations to the State Liquor and Lottery Commission regarding the retail prices of spirits sold in the State and instead requires the bureau to establish the wholesale and retail prices of spirits sold in this State through major substantive rulemaking. The rulemaking must:
29 30	1. Seek to ensure the bureau receives sufficient, but not excessive, revenues to meet the requirements of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 28-A;
31 32	2. Seek to ensure equitable prices for similar products across product price and bottle size;
33	3. Seek to ensure equitable price markups based on product price or bottle size; and
34 35	4. Seek to avoid disproportionate impacts on spirits suppliers and agency liquor stores due to product price or bottle size.
36 37 38 39 40	The committee has not taken a position on the substance of this bill. By reporting this bill out, the committee is not suggesting and does not intend to suggest that it agrees or disagrees with any aspect of this bill. The committee is reporting the bill out for the sole purpose of having a bill printed that can be referred to the committee for an appropriate public hearing and subsequent processing in the normal course.
