An Act to Exempt Buildings Used to Cultivate Crops from the Maine Uniform Building and Energy Code

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	Sec. 1. 10 MRSA §9722, sub-§6, ¶B-1, as enacted by PL 2019, c. 391, §4, is amended by amending subparagraph (4) to read:
4 5 6 7	(4) That buildings used to house livestock or , <u>store</u> harvested crops <u>or cultivate</u> <u>crops</u> are not subject to the Maine Uniform Building and Energy Code. The <u>exemption in this subparagraph does not include the cultivation of cannabis</u> <u>regulated under Title 22 or 28-B</u> ;
8 9 10	SUMMARY This bill exempts buildings used to cultivate crops from the Maine Uniform Building and Energy Code, except that it does not exempt buildings used to cultivate cannabis.
