14	'Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §219-A, as enacted by PL 2021, c. 177, §1, is repealed.
15	Sec. 2. 7 MRSA §219-C is enacted to read:
16	§219-C. Returnable, reusable or refillable containers and packaging
17 18 19	1. Use permitted; rules and guidelines. The department shall ensure that its rules, established in accordance with the commissioner's rule-making authority in section 12, and guidelines:
20 21	A. Explicitly allow a business, on a voluntary basis, to allow consumers to supply their own containers or packaging for the purchase of:
22	(1) Nonfood items;
23	(2) Shelf-stable food items; and
24 25	(3) Food other than shelf-stable food items as determined by the department by rule.
26 27 28 29	B. Explicitly allow a business, on a voluntary basis, to sell nonfood items, shelf-stable food items and other food to consumers in the State in returnable, reusable or refillable containers and packaging, which may be supplied by either the business or a 3rd party; and
30 31	C. Explicitly establish the right of a business to refuse any returnable, reusable or refillable container or packaging supplied by a consumer.
32 33	2. Reuse permitted. A returnable, reusable or refillable container or packaging returned by a consumer may be reclaimed by a business or a 3rd party, restored to standards
