COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1370, L.D. 2146, "An Act to Prohibit Certain Municipalities from Adopting Moratoria on Emergency Shelters"

Amend the bill in section 1 in §4364-D in the 2nd line (page 1, line 4 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "30,000" and inserting the following: '20,000'

Amend the bill in section 1 in §4364-D in the first indented paragraph in the first line (page 1, line 5 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "30,000" and inserting the following: '20,000'

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, changes the population over which a municipality is prohibited from adopting a moratorium on establishing emergency shelters from 30,000 people to 20,000 people.
