In the event the department determines by rule that stamping, embossing, individual wrapping or blister packaging for a particular type of edible cannabis product is impracticable, each serving of the product must be packaged together and the universal symbol affixed to the packaging. For purposes of this chapter, edible cannabis products that are determined impracticable to stamp, emboss, individually wrap or blister package include but are not limited to:

It changes existing law to allow a universal symbol to be affixed to an individually wrapped 5 6 or blister packaged edible cannabis product, and it identifies the following edible cannabis 7 products as impracticable to emboss, stamp, individually wrap or blister package: potato or corn chips, popcorn, pretzels and loose granola. These edible cannabis products, and any 8 other edible cannabis product determined by the Department of Administrative and 9 10 Financial Services by rule to be impracticable to stamp, emboss, individually wrap or 11 blister package, must be packaged together with the universal symbol affixed to the 12 packaging. 13 FISCAL NOTE REQUIRED 14 (See attached)
