1 2	<b>Emergency preamble. Whereas,</b> acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
3 4	Whereas, current law requires edible cannabis products to be labeled with a universal symbol in order to be sold or offered for sale; and
5 6 7	<b>Whereas,</b> this legislation proposes to remove the requirement for edible cannabis products to be embossed or stamped with a universal symbol in order to be sold or offered for sale; and
8 9 10	Whereas, this legislation needs to take effect as soon as possible since new guidance from the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, office of cannabis policy is affecting businesses currently operating; and
11 12 13 14	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
15	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
16 17	<b>Sec. 1. 28-B MRSA §703, sub-§1, ¶D,</b> as amended by PL 2019, c. 491, §5, is repealed.
18 19	<b>Emergency clause.</b> In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved.
20	SUMMARY
21 22	This bill removes the requirement that edible cannabis products be stamped or embossed on each serving with a universal symbol in order to be sold or offered for sale.
