An Act to Exempt Seasonal Volunteer Ski Patrollers and Seasonal Volunteer Ski Ambassadors and Hosts at Ski Areas from the Minimum Wage Laws

1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §663, sub-§3, ¶K**, as amended by PL 2009, c. 529, §2, is further
3 amended to read:

4 K. A salaried employee who works in a bona fide executive, administrative or
5 professional capacity and whose regular compensation, when converted to an annual
6 rate, exceeds 3000 times the State's minimum hourly wage or the annualized rate
7 established by the United States Department of Labor under the federal Fair Labor
8 Standards Act, whichever is higher; and

9 **Sec. 2. 26 MRSA §663, sub-§3, ¶L**, as amended by PL 2013, c. 133, §20, is further
10 amended by amending subparagraph (6) to read:

11 (6) Employed while in a community confinement monitoring program pursuant to
12 Title 30-A, section 1659-A; and

13 **Sec. 3. 26 MRSA §663, sub-§3, ¶M** is enacted to read:

14 M. A person who is a seasonal volunteer ski patroller or a seasonal volunteer
15 ambassador or host at a ski area.

16 **SUMMARY**

17 This bill exempts seasonal volunteer ski patrollers and seasonal volunteer ski
18 ambassadors and hosts at ski areas from the minimum wage laws.
