2 3	Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §663, sub-§3, ¶K, as amended by PL 2009, c. 529, §2, is further amended to read:

A salaried employee who works in a bona fide executive, administrative or professional capacity and whose regular compensation, when converted to an annual rate, exceeds 3000 times the State's minimum hourly wage or the annualized rate established by the United States Department of Labor under the federal Fair Labor Standards Act, whichever is higher; and
9 10	Sec. 2. 26 MRSA §663, sub-§3, ¶L, as amended by PL 2013, c. 133, §20, is further amended by amending subparagraph (6) to read:
