Except as provided in subsections 1 and 2, when concurrent jurisdiction has been established pursuant to Title 15, section 3101, subsection 2, paragraph F, the Juvenile Court has exclusive original jurisdiction over a case involving a juvenile who is alleged to have committed a juvenile crime as defined in Title 15, section 3103, subsection 1.
18 19	Amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.
20	SUMMARY
21 22 23	This amendment clarifies that the Juvenile Court has exclusive original jurisdiction over a case involving a juvenile who is alleged to have committed a juvenile crime, regardless of where that crime is committed.
