1           **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not  
2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

3           **Whereas,** the State has recently experienced severe weather-related events that have  
4 caused power outages, flooding and other negative effects; and

5           **Whereas,** recent severe weather-related events have significantly affected small  
6 business owners during the busiest revenue season for small businesses in the State; and

7           **Whereas,** the loss of revenue experienced by small businesses as a result of recent  
8 severe weather-related events constitutes an emergency; and

9           **Whereas,** in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within  
10 the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as  
11 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now,  
12 therefore,

13 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

14           **Sec. 1. Small Business Weather Emergency Relief Program.**

15           **1. Program established.** The Small Business Weather Emergency Relief Program is  
16 established in the Department of Economic and Community Development as a nonlapsing  
17 General Fund program account administered by the department to provide relief payments  
18 to small businesses in the State affected by severe weather-related events and consists of  
19 money appropriated to it by the Legislature from the General Fund.

20           **2. Rules.** The Department of Economic and Community Development shall adopt  
21 rules necessary to carry out this section, including eligibility requirements, application  
22 processes and methods for determining award amounts, no later than March 30, 2024. Rules  
23 adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules as defined in the Maine  
24 Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

25           **Sec. 2. Appropriations and allocations.** The following appropriations and  
26 allocations are made.

27 **ECONOMIC AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT, DEPARTMENT OF**  
28 **Small Business Weather Emergency Relief Program N479**

29 Initiative: Provides one-time funds for payments to small businesses for relief from severe  
30 weather-related events.

35           **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation  
36 takes effect when approved.

37 **SUMMARY**

38 This bill establishes the Small Business Weather Emergency Relief Program to provide  
39 relief payments to small businesses affected by severe weather-related events and directs

1 the Department of Economic and Community Development to adopt rules for the  
2 administration of the program, including eligibility requirements, application processes and  
3 methods for determining award amounts, no later than March 30, 2024. The bill includes a  
4 one-time General Fund appropriation of \$50,000,000 in fiscal year 2023-24 to the program.
