An Act to Ensure Subsidy Reimbursements and Emergency Financial Assistance for Certain Child Care Providers

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3737, sub-§6 is enacted to read:

6. Reimbursements for subsidies. The department shall reimburse a provider of child care services provided under this chapter for subsidy payments under the child care subsidy program in section 3737-B administered by the department pursuant to rules adopted by the department. Reimbursement under the program to a child care provider must be based on generally accepted payment practices for private-pay families for child care, including enrollment-based rather than attendance-based practices, and may not be reduced or eliminated based on a child's attendance. Reimbursement based on generally accepted payment practices must support child care provider stability and encourage more child care providers to serve children receiving child care services. In developing the program, the department shall identify the practices common for child care providers serving privatepay families and determine which practices are most important to meet the goals of ensuring that high-quality child care providers will participate in the subsidy program and make a plan to align requirements for providers accepting children receiving federal Child Care and Development Fund child care assistance to the practices of private-paying child care providers. The department shall examine generally accepted payment practices regarding paying prospectively based on enrollment and practices related to separating provider closure limits for holidays or vacations or to compensate for inclement weather from child absence allowances. The department shall adopt rules to implement this subsection. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

For the purposes of this subsection, "generally accepted payment practices" are practices that align with the private-paying child care market in order to encourage providers to accept children receiving federal Child Care and Development Fund child care assistance and enable families to retain child care services.

Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §3737-B is enacted to read:

§3737-B. Emergency financial assistance to child care providers

- 1. Program created. The department shall establish a program to provide short-term emergency financial assistance to child care providers. The program must be designed to provide emergency financial assistance to child care providers on a one-time basis, based on need. The financial assistance may consist of grants or loans to support short-term facility or operational costs. The department shall provide technical assistance for providers to support their financial planning, capacity and stability.
- 2. Rules. The department shall adopt rules to implement this section. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

38 SUMMARY

This bill requires the Department of Health and Human Services to reimburse child care providers for subsidies based on enrollment rather than attendance. The bill also directs the department to create a program to provide short-term, one-time emergency financial assistance to child care providers based on need to support short-term facility or operational

costs, and to provide technical assistance to support their financial planning, capacity and stability.
