Complaints. The office shall make available numerous methods for individuals to 18 submit civil rights violation complaints. The confidentiality of civil rights violation 19 complaints is governed by the Intelligence and Investigative Record Information Act.' 20 Amend the bill in section 1 in §200-O in subsection 6 in the 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th lines 21 (page 1, lines 34 to 37 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "Before the unit may submit 22 the report to the Legislature, the unit shall submit the report to the Civil Rights Review Panel established by section 200-P. The report must be submitted to the panel no later than 23 January 1st annually." 24 25 Amend the bill in section 1 in §200-O in subsection 6 by inserting at the end a new 26 blocked paragraph to read: 27 'After reviewing the report, the joint standing committee of the Legislature having 28 jurisdiction over civil rights matters may report out legislation related to the report to any 29 regular or special session of the Legislature.' 30 Amend the bill by striking out all of section 2. Amend the bill by striking out all of section 4 and inserting the following: 31 'Sec. 4. 5 MRSA §4684-C, sub-§4 is enacted to read: 32 33 4. Ongoing enhanced civil rights training. A civil rights officer shall undergo ongoing enhanced civil rights training administered by the Maine Criminal Justice 34

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Academy, as determined by the Office of the Attorney General, to remain qualified as a civil rights officer.'

Amend the bill by striking out all of section 5.

Amend the bill by striking out all of section 6 and inserting the following:

'Sec. 6. 25 MRSA §2804-O is enacted to read:

§2804-O. Ongoing enhanced civil rights training for civil rights officers

A law enforcement officer qualified as a civil rights officer within the meaning of Title 5, section 4684-C, subsection 1, paragraph A shall undergo ongoing enhanced civil rights training administered by the Maine Criminal Justice Academy, as determined by the Office of the Attorney General, to remain qualified as a civil rights officer.

SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, strikes the provisions of the bill establishing the Civil Rights Review Panel. It also clarifies that the confidentiality of civil rights violation complaints is governed by the Intelligence and Investigative Record Information Act. The amendment also adds language to make clear and consistent among the provisions of law that govern the training of civil rights officers that a civil rights officer must undergo enhanced ongoing civil rights training as directed by the Office of the Attorney General in order to remain qualified as a civil rights officer.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill creates a civil rights unit within the Office of the Attorney General to promote and advance protections under the Maine Civil Rights Act. The bill includes ongoing General Fund appropriations to the Office of the Attorney General of \$193,594 in fiscal year 2024-25 for one Assistant Attorney General position and one Paralegal position beginning September 1, 2024 to coordinate cases, education, outreach and reporting related to the Maine Civil Rights Act.
