SUMMARY

29 This amendment amends Committee Amendment "A" by removing the \$10,000,000 30 General Fund appropriation to support public-private partnerships that facilitate strategic investments in the State's agricultural, food and forest products processing and 31 32 manufacturing industries and replacing it with a \$269,924 transfer from the unappropriated 33 surplus of the General Fund to the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, 34 Maine Agriculture, Food and Forest Products Investment Fund, Other Special Revenue 35 Funds account. The amendment also reduces the funding in fiscal year 2024-25 for the 36 Public Service Manager II position to account for a one-month delay in the establishment 37 of the position.

#### **Fiscal Detail and Notes**

This amendment removes the one-time General Fund appropriation of \$10,000,000 in fiscal year 2024-25 and replaces it with a one-time transfer of \$269,924 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Maine Agriculture, Food and Forest Products Investment Fund, Other Special Revenue Funds account. The amendment also reduces General Fund appropriation for the Public Service Manager II position in fiscal year 2024-25 by having it start August 12, 2024.
