1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §320-C, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 2021, c. 483, Pt. KK, §2, repealed and the following enacted in its place: 2. Membership. The board consists of the commissioner or the commissioner designee, the Commissioner of Economic and Community Development or the commissioner's designee and 15 members pursuant to this subsection.

7 8	M. The commissioner and the Commissioner of Economic and Community Development shall jointly appoint 5 members of the board as follows:		
9 10	(1) Two members from relevant financial institutions with experience in the agricultural and forest products industries;		
11	(2) One manufacturer of forest products;		
12 13	(3) One manufacturer of value-added agricultural products or representative of the value-added agricultural products industry; and		
14 15	(4) One member actively engaged in providing marketing assistance, market development or business and financial planning.		
16	N. The President of the Senate shall appoint 5 members of the board as follows:		
17 18	(1) One member of a statewide industry group representing conventional nondairy farming:		
19 20	(2) One member of a statewide industry group representing the forest products industry;		
21 22	(3) One member representing the supply chain in processing, manufacturing or distribution;		
23	(4) One member of a statewide industry group representing dairy producers; and		
24 25	(5) One member representing historically underserved racial populations in nondairy farming.		
26	O. The Speaker of the House shall appoint 5 members of the board as follows:

Sec. 2. 7 MRSA §320-C, sub-§7 is enacted to read:

7. Board member conflicts of interest. If a member of the board holds a position in a producer or business that causes a conflict of interest with regard to a vote the board is holding, the member may not participate in that vote.

Sec. 3. 7 MRSA §320-C, sub-§8 is enacted to read:

8. Uses of disbursements limited. A producer that receives a disbursement from the fund must have a processing or manufacturing facility that is located in the State, shall use the disbursement to support the operations of the facility and shall use the disbursement to obtain the primary agricultural, food or forest product used in its commercial products from a farm or a forest or waters in the State or from offshore waters to be collected in the State.

Sec. 4. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and allocations are made.

AGRICULTURE, CONSERVATION AND FORESTRY, DEPARTMENT OF

Maine Agriculture, Food and Forest Products Investment Fund Z384

Initiative: Provides one-time funding to support public-private partnerships that facilitate strategic investments in the State's agricultural, food and forest products processing and manufacturing industries. These funds are nonlapsing.

24 SUMMARY

This bill amends the laws governing the Maine Agriculture, Food System and Forest Products Infrastructure Investment Advisory Board to require the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House to appoint members to the board and prohibit a member of the board who holds a position in a producer or business that causes a conflict of interest with regard to a vote the board is holding from participating in that vote. It also requires producers of agricultural, food and forest products receiving disbursements from the Maine Agriculture, Food and Forest Products Investment Fund to obtain their primary agricultural, food or forest products from within the State.

Finally, this bill provides a one-time appropriation of \$10,000,000 in fiscal year 2024-25 to the fund.
