
SENATE AMENDMENT "B" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 947,
L.D. 2213, "An Act to Support Veterans' Organizations and Other Nonprofit Organizations
and Federally Recognized Indian Tribes by Updating Electronic Gambling Laws"

Amend the amendment in section 23 in §1835-C in subsection 1 in the first blocked
paragraph in the first line (page 5, line 32 in amendment) by striking out the following:
"1%" and inserting the following: '2%'

Amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or
section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment increases from 1% to 2% the percentage of gross revenue from the
operation of electronic lucky seven devices that may be collected from persons licensed to
operate such devices.
