COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 955, L.D. 2230, "An Act to Change 9 Department of Health and Human Services Rules Regarding Youth Camps to Major 10 11 Substantive Rules"

Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

13 'Resolve, to Require a Stakeholder Group to Participate in the Development of Rules 14 **Regarding Youth Camps'** 

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the title and inserting the following:

16 'Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

18 Whereas, proposed rules that govern the operations of youth camps in the State must 19 include the participation of operators of youth camps; and

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Whereas, the youth camp season begins earlier than 90 days after adjournment; and

21 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within 22 the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as 23 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 24 therefore, be it

25 Sec. 1. Department of Health and Human Services to convene stakeholder 26 group to provide input on youth camp rules. Resolved: That the Department of 27 Health and Human Services, referred to in this resolve as "the department," shall convene 28 a stakeholder group of interested parties, including operators of youth camps, to participate 29 in the development of proposals to amend the department's rule Chapter 208: Rules 30 Relating to Boys, Girls, Boys and Girls, Day Camps and Primitive and Trip Camping, prior 31 to publishing a rule change for public comment in accordance with the Maine 32 Administrative Procedure Act. The department shall convene the stakeholder group as 33 soon as possible to solicit input for the department's consideration and engage stakeholders 34 in good faith consistent with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 8052 and section 35 8057-A, subsection 3. The department shall maintain a record of stakeholder meetings,

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including a summary of meetings and explanations of decisions reached by the department and provide these materials to the stakeholder group.

Sec. 2. Rule adoption. Resolved: That the department may not adopt any rules that amend its rule Chapter 208: Rules Relating to Boys, Girls, Boys and Girls, Day Camps and Primitive and Trip Camping until the department has convened and engaged a stakeholder group pursuant to section 1.

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved.'

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

#### **SUMMARY**

12 This amendment replaces the bill with a resolve and adds an emergency preamble and 13 clause. It requires the Department of Health and Human Services to convene a stakeholder 14 group to participate in the development of proposals to amend its rule Chapter 208: Rules 15 Relating to Boys, Girls, Boys and Girls, Day Camps and Primitive and Trip Camping prior 16 to publishing a rule change for public comment and adoption under the Maine 17 Administrative Procedure Act. The department may not adopt any rules to amend its rule 18 Chapter 208 until the department has convened and engaged a stakeholder group.
