- 1. Administration; directed to certain training programs. Funding provided by this Act for grants to support preapprenticeship training programs is subject to the provisions of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 26, section 3213, subsection 6 and must:

23 24 25 26 27 28	This amendment removes from the bill the provisions providing for the registration of preapprenticeship training programs. It retains the current law allowing for certification of these programs. It specifies that at least 51% of the funds provided for grants to support preapprenticeship training programs must support training programs that have consistently placed individuals in registered apprenticeship programs that lead to jobs that pay no less than \$35 per hour.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill includes Other Special Revenue Funds allocations totaling \$12,000,000 in fiscal year 2024-25 to the Maine Apprenticeship Program within the Department of Labor to support preapprenticeship training programs. Of this amount, \$11,887,635 is allocated on a one-time basis for grants to support the training programs and \$112,365 is allocated on an ongoing basis for one Program Manager Employment & Training position and related All Other costs to administer the grant program. A one-time transfer of \$12,000,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Maine Apprenticeship Program is provided in fiscal year 2024-25 to fund the program.
