SENATE AMENDMENT " & " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 995, L.D. 2280, "An Act to Strengthen Maine's Workforce Through Preapprenticeship Training Programs"

Amend the amendment in section 1 in subsection 6 in the 8th line (page 1, line 22 in amendment) by striking out the following: "and funding to facilitate" and inserting the following: '; for assistance to address obstacles and to identify and access services necessary for successful participation in a preapprenticeship training program; and for facilitating'

Amend the amendment by striking out all of sections 3 and 4 and inserting the following:

'Sec. 3. Federal funding directed to Maine Apprenticeship Program, fiscal years 2024-25 and 2025-26. For fiscal years 2024-25 and 2025-26, as permitted by federal law, regulation, guidance and grant guidelines and as determined by the Office of Policy Innovation and the Future established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 3102, the Office of Policy Innovation and the Future shall coordinate a process to direct to the Maine Apprenticeship Program established in Title 26, section 3202 1% of all funding that has been or will be received pursuant to the federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, the federal Inflation Reduction Act of 2022, the federal CHIPS Act of 2022 and any other federal law providing new or expanded funding that is available on or after July 1, 2024 for workforce development activities or for the creation of high-wage, in-demand jobs in apprenticeable occupations, as defined in Title 26, section 3201, subsection 2. The funds directed to the Maine Apprenticeship Program pursuant to this section may not exceed \$12,000,000 and are to be used to make available grants to support preapprenticeship training programs pursuant to Title 26, section 3213, subsection 6.

The amendment instead, for fiscal years 2024-25 and 2025-26, requires the Office of Policy Innovation and the Future to coordinate a process to direct to the Maine Apprenticeship Program 1% of all funding that has been or will be received pursuant to the federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, the federal Inflation Reduction Act of 2022, the federal CHIPS Act of 2022 and any other federal law providing new or expanded funding that is available on or after July 1, 2024 for workforce development activities or for the creation of high-wage, in-demand jobs in apprenticeable occupations. The funding directed to the Maine Apprenticeship Program may not exceed \$12,000,000.

This amendment eliminates the Other Special Revenue Funds allocations totaling \$12,000,000 in fiscal year 2024-25 to the Maine Apprenticeship Program within the Department of Labor to support preapprenticeship training programs and, instead, provides a one-time Federal Expenditures Fund allocation in the same amount to the Department of Labor to authorize the expenditure of a portion of federal funds received by the State from the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act of 2021, the Inflation Reduction Act of 2022 and any other federal Act providing new or expanded funding that is available on or after July 1, 2024 for workforce development activities, or for the creation of high wage, in-demand jobs in apprenticeable occupations. A Federal Expenditures Fund allocation for the same amount will be required in fiscal year 2025-26 as well. This amendment also eliminates the one-time transfer of \$12,000,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Maine Apprenticeship Program included in the bill to fund the program.
