HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 792,  
L.D. 1187, "An Act to Require Certain Mental Health Data to Be Included in Uniform  
Crime Reports"

Amend the amendment by striking out the substitute title and substituting the  
following:

**'An Act to Include Certain Mental Health Assessment Data in Firearm Fatalities and  
Hospitalizations Reports'**

Amend the amendment in section 1 in the c. 256-A headnote in the last line (page 1,  
line 19 in amendment) by striking out the following: "REFERRALS" and inserting the  
following: "ASSESSMENT DATA"

Amend the amendment in section 2 in §1425 in the last line (page 1, line 23 in  
amendment) by striking out the following: "referrals" and inserting the following:  
'assessment data'

Amend the amendment by striking out all of sections 5 and 6 and inserting the  
following:

**'Sec. 5. 22 MRSA §1425, sub-§3 is enacted to read:**

**3. Risk assessments.** The number of assessments by a medical practitioner performed  
pursuant to Title 34-B, section 3862-A, the number of individuals assessed who received a  
referral for mental health treatment and services and any aggregate demographic  
information about the individuals assessed that can be released without risking individual  
identification.'

Amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or  
section number to read consecutively.

**SUMMARY**

This amendment replaces the requirement in Committee Amendment "A" that the  
annual report on firearm fatalities and hospitalizations include mental health referrals with  
a requirement that the annual report include the number of assessments performed, the  
number of individuals who received a referral for mental health treatment and services and  
any aggregate demographic information about those individuals that can be released

**Fiscal Detail and Notes**

The amendment eliminates the one-time General Fund appropriation to the Department of Health and Human Services of \$1,875,219 in fiscal year 2025-26. The amendment also removes the requirement that the annual report on firearm fatalities and hospitalizations from the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention within the Department of Health and Human Services include the number of mental health referrals for individuals assessed as presenting a likelihood of foreseeable harm, and instead require the report to include the number of assessments made, the number of individuals who received a referral for an additional mental health assessment, and any aggregate demographic information about those individuals that can be released without risking individual identification.
